Pledge of Allegiance and a moment of silence for our fallen Bikers, Friends, Family and Military

Scott Herbert filled in for Greg Nowak, who was unable to attend the meeting.

TREASURER: Sue Foose

Sue welcomed everyone to the meeting. She thanked the veterans for their service and all who brought food for our annual thanksgiving potluck. She read the treasurer report, listing balances and expenditures. Also let us know there is a service fee for cash deposits on our bank account She thanked the chapter for the opportunity to be our treasurer for the last 2 years and wished the new treasurer much success in 2022.

Minutes for October have been approved, published in the Newsletter and posted to the website.

- Sue Foose asked what was the approval process for the newsletter. Carolyn Fox, Editor, explained that after the monthly newsletter "draft" is completed, the editor sends it to the Chapter Director for review, changes and approvals. The Newsletter is then sent to the dealership for review, changes/updates and approvals.
- Sue then asked, what is the process if there is an error found in the newsletter <u>after it is posted</u> to the members and website. Carolyn answered that, if an error is found, she would send an email to the members reporting the error/corrections. - It was mentioned that the person that had signed up to be our LOH lead decided not to do it because she didn't have the time to give to LOH that she felt it deserved. 
We have chapter patches available. Prices are on the back. Catalogs if you are looking for something special.


